## GPGC Legacy Continues with Smaller Numbers

With two summers in between the current and last GPGC, most of this year's class is freshmen, with only two returning students.

As this new era of GPGC starts, students may have questions about the history of the program.

As it turns out, this year's
session, which has 19 students, is not the smallest on record. That title belongs to the first GPGC session of 1959, according to Josh Brown, director of the GPGC. The program's largest summer was 179 students in 1982, Mr. Brown said. That class included six students gifted in visual arts, a category the program no longer
includes. The summer of 1981 was also a large one, with three freshman classes of about 20 students each.

He said the small number of students in this summer's program makes the experience less stressful for everyone. The staff can get to know the students better and in a much shorter amount of time.

The program is currently in its 62 nd session (but its 64th year), and the small number of students means different processes and procedures for this year.

The government is another element that will change, reverting to a more Athe-nian-style democracy because of the smaller numbers, Mr. Brown said.

## Werewolf: A Fun Game To Play!

The game Werewolf is somewhat of a card game but is more talkative.

The players will receive one card from the gamemaster. There is no right or wrong way to make the cards, but they should be either thick enough or discreet enough so you can't see other's cards.

The people playing, when they get their cards, should look at them discreetly. Make sure the other people do not see your card, it will ruin the secretive aspect of the game!

The game moderator will tell everyone to "go to sleep" which means close your eyes.

The game moderator will then say "werewolves wake up," and the people who got the werewolf card will open their eyes and choose someone to "kill." That person will then die unless they are protected by the priest/bodyguard.

The bodyguard can choose a new person to protect each night but the priest can protect one person only for the entirety of the game.

Each night is a round, and the rounds last long enough so all the night roles can do
their ability.
You can make your own roles, but mandatory cards are werewolf cards and villager cards.

Some cards that make the game more fun (just from the actual game) are the seer, spellcaster and cupid.

The seer can choose one person per night to see so they know that person's role.

The spellcaster can choose one person every night to silence during the talking and voting period.

The cupid wakes up only once, on the first night, and choses two people to be lovers. If one of those two dies the other dies of a broken heart.

After all of the night roles have done their job, they will return to sleep and then the moderator will tell everyone to wake up.

They must then describe the murder scene with extreme detail. Something preferably along the lines of "The werewolves took his/her blood and made a picture of Pepe the frog and they wrote 'Werewolves Wuz Here' on the wall."

The players will then state their suspicions about who is the werewolf, and

then when everything is all said and done the players will vote on who should go out. They will say the name of or point to the person they wish to vote for.

When you are voted you will hold up a finger to show how many votes you have. The person with the most votes will show their card and then die/leave the game.

The werewolves win if
they kill enough people so that the number of werewolves is equal to the number of villagers. The villagers win if they vote out all the werewolves.

Werewolf is a very fun game, and I would recommend you play it. You can buy a box of cards or make your own. Either way just enjoy the game, and I hope this article helped.
